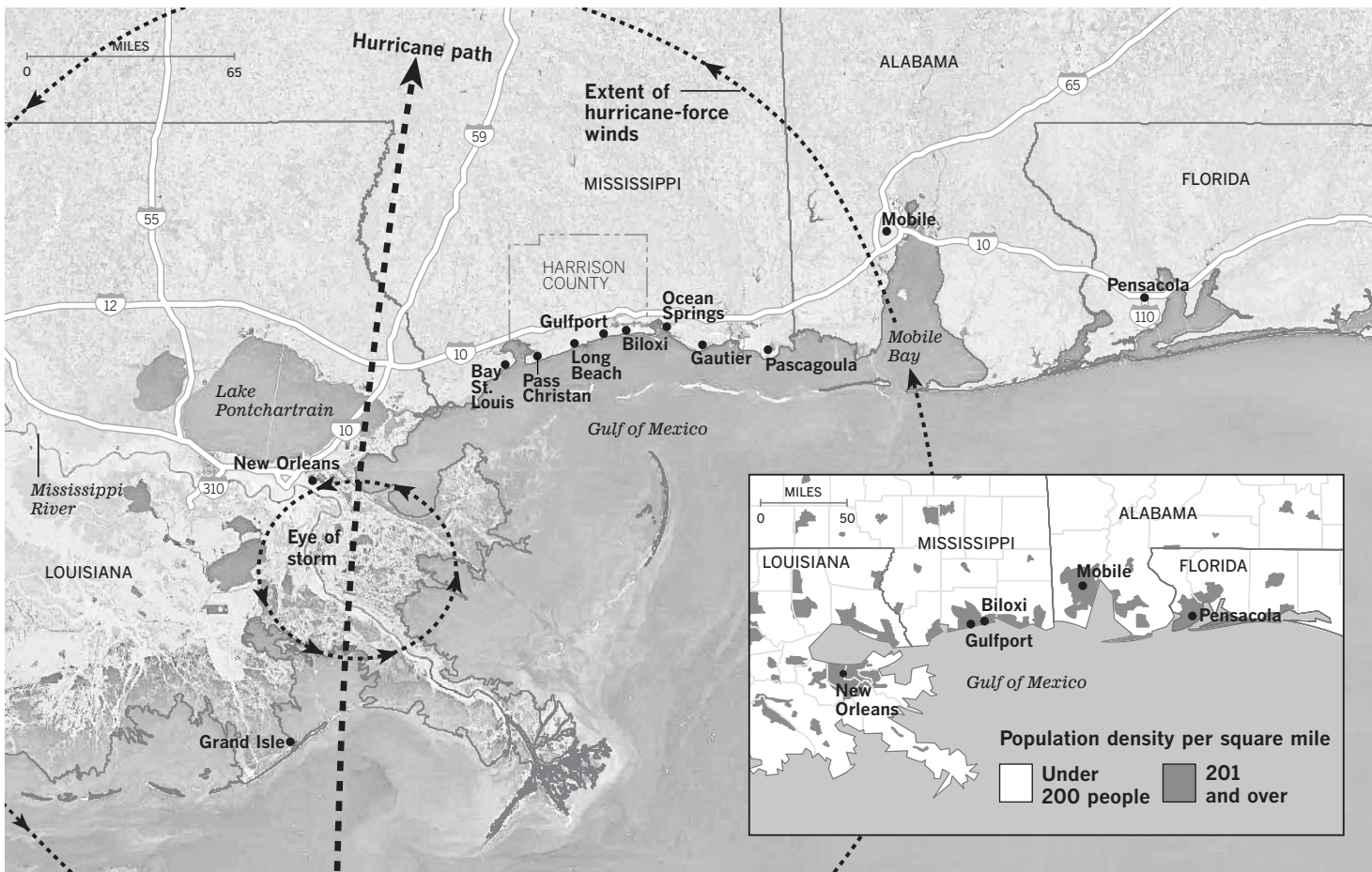


Widespread woe

New Orleans is the center of attention in Katrina's wake, but damage and death cover a roughly 200-mile swath of the Gulf Coast.



Coastal damage

Area wide

- 2.1 million without power from Louisiana to the Florida Panhandle (790,000 in Alabama)

Mississippi

- Naval station in Pascagoula evacuated and ships put to sea
- Ocean Springs and Bay St. Louis bridges collapse

- 30 thought dead in apartment building collapse in Biloxi
- 50 estimated dead in Harrison County
- Several Gulf Coast casinos damaged or destroyed, particularly in Biloxi
- Interstate 10 underwater in the Gulfport area

Alabama

- Homes flooded along Mobile Bay's eastern shore
- The Cochrane-Africatown Bridge on U.S. 98 in Mobile closed when an oil rig broke loose and wedged beneath it
- Portions of downtown Mobile under 8 to 12 feet of water
- Severe coastal flooding

Gulf

- 95% of normal daily Gulf oil production of about 1.4 million barrels shut down

Florida

- Hotels along Interstate 10 in the Panhandle filled with refugees fleeing the hurricane
