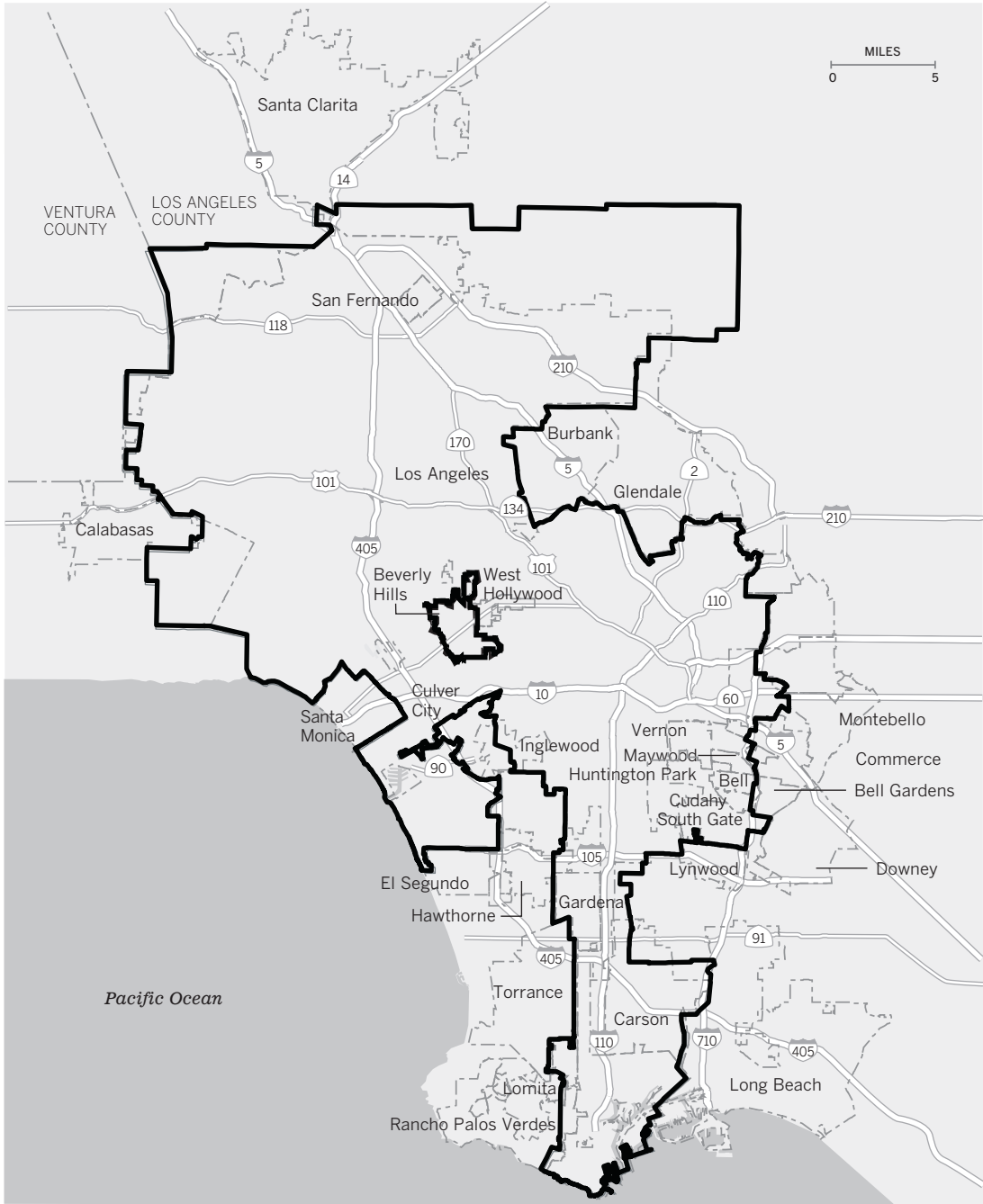


# A far-reaching district

The Los Angeles Unified School District has a convoluted boundary that includes Los Angeles, more than two dozen other cities and swaths of unincorporated county territory. More than 146,000 students and 249,000 registered voters live outside Los Angeles city limits but within the district.
