MEMORANDUM FOR: CHIEF OF STAFF, UNITED STATES ARMY

SUBJECT: Herbert's Soldier

1. I have chaired a review of Soldier by Anthony B. Herbert, based upon your expressed interest in this matter. Herbert's allegations, when viewed in the light of criminal investigation reports on investigations conducted as a result of statements made to USACIDC by LTC Herbert, impeach Herbert's credibility; he is a liar.
2. At Tab A is an index of Herbert's allegations made to USACIDC and also contained in Soldier. These allegations are discussed separately at Tab B; 9 of the 21 were founded on sufficient evidence and the remaining either lack sufficient evidence to prove or disprove Herbert's allegations or were referred to the IG as they were managerial in nature rather than criminal.
3. At Tab C is a listing of allegations which appear only in Soldier; Herbert, in his 15 days of TDY to this headquarters, did not bring up these points when he initially made his allegations; and these points were not investigated by CID. It is my opinion that many of these items were passed on to Herbert after he made his initial allegations or they were figments of his imagination.
4. At Tab D are incidents which are not contained in Soldier but were contained in Herbert's initial statements; they were investigated by CID; 5 were unfounded and 2 were founded.
5. This package, should Herbert's book or Herbert himself again rise in high profile, provides sufficient material to impeach this man's credibility; should this need arise, I volunteer for the task.
